We are delighted to announce that Kairos WWT has been awarded the PQASSO Quality Mark at Level 1.

PQASSO (Practical Quality Assurance System for Small Organisations) is the leading quality standard developed for the third sector, by the sector. The standard requires organisations to evidence that they meet the standard required across 12 key areas including Planning, Governance, Leadership & Management, User-Centred Service, Managing People, Learning & Development, Managing Money, Managing Resources, Communications & Promotions, Working

With Others, Monitoring & Evaluation and Results.

The staff team and board have been fantastic and I can honestly say, despite it only being a short period of time I feel



Kairos's Prevention Agenda

On Wednesday 5th June 2013, Kairos reviewed it's mission statement to take account of our organisations increased focus on prevention,:


“Kairos Women Working Together (WWT) believes in the value and dignity of all women. We aim to support, empower and give a voice to women at risk of, or subject to, sexual exploitation including those caught up in sex work and those aspiring to leave it. We work in Coventry by providing safe spaces, a listening ear and opportunities for growth and change.”

In November and December 2013, Kairos supported a Safeguarding Children Board initiative; Chelsea's Choice.



Chelsea's Choice is a play that has toured round schools in Coventry to raise awareness around sexual exploitation. Kairos worked in partnership with CRASAC and The Children's Society to offer

support during and after these productions for any students who had questions about the material explored in the play or those who wanted to make disclosures about things that had happened to them or their friends.



In support of the Chelsea' Choice initiative, Kairos produced a sexual exploitation leaflet which was included in the teacher's packs accompanying the play.

This leaflet was written to raise awareness for young people of sexual exploitation. The booklet covered a range of topics including; consent, the grooming process, relationships, social media safety and safety tips. We were also privileged to be able to include a real life story of grooming written by an ex-Kairos service user. In addition to supporting the Chelsea's Choice initiative, Kairos has continued to offer group sessions to young people at risk of sexual exploitation. This work identified a gap in service for young women over the age of 18 years old who are at risk of sexual exploitation. These women need one-to-one support to explore their particular risk factors. In response, Kairos has developed a structured work programme that is being delivered to young women between the ages of 18 and 24 on an individual basis.

This work programme covers a range of topics associated with sexual exploitation including: relationships, resolving conflict, domestic abuse, consent, grooming, online safety, myths and stereotypes and risky behaviours. The aim of these sessions is to raise awareness with young women who are at risk of sexual exploitation and support them to manage associated risks.

We have received some great feedback from young people currently engaging in the 12 session programme:
