Kairos Extends Its Mission

On Wednesday 5th June, Kairos WWT held an Extraordinary General Meeting to revise and refine our Mission Statement and Aims. Members of Kairos WWT participated in a full discussion regarding the work that we undertake and our increasing focus on the prevention strand of our mission. We wanted to reflect with more accuracy, our philosophy regarding sexual exploitation and ensure our language reflected the breadth of our services.

Research from women caught up in sex work reveals that over half (some figures suggest up to 75%) began their involvement in prostitution before their 18th birthday (Paying the Price: The Home Office, 2004).

Over the last 18 months, we have been developing our partnership with The Children's Society and responding to the need highlighted by Coventry City Council's Analysis of local support services to work in schools to help young people recognise

the signs of targeted exploitation.

This partnership has enhanced our understanding (see page 2) and the invaluable work we have undertaken with young people up to the age of 24 has shaped our vision for the future which has a strong emphasis on prevention.

Our revised Mission Statement and Aims:

Mission Statement:

Kairos Women Working Together (WWT) believes in the value and dignity of all women. We aim to support, empower, and give a voice to women at risk of or subject to sexual exploitation, including those caught up in sex work and those aspiring to leave it. We work in Coventry by providing safe spaces, a listening ear and opportunities for change & growth.

Aims:

To support and empower women at risk of or subject to sexual exploitation, including those caught up in sex work and those aspiring to leave it

To offer safe spaces for women

To offer a listening ear and to give a voice through advocacy

To create a wide range of opportunities for development, change and growth

To promote self-advocacy, self-care and independence

To facilitate access to other professional services



Sexual Exploitation

At Kairos WWT we believe that someone can be a victim of sexual exploitation at any age. We view sex work as part of sexual exploitation and believe that the women we work with have limited choice and agency where involvement in prostitution is concerned.

Sexual exploitation is where someone is being forced or manipulated into sexual activity in exchange for something — money, gifts or accommodation or less tangible goods such as affection or status. The sexual activity and exchange may be seen as consensual but are based on imbalance of power which severely limits victim's options and agency.

The risk factors associated with sexual exploitation, including sex work, include substance abuse, poverty,

historical abuse, time spent in care, domestic violence, physical and emotional difficulties, poor educational attainment and family breakdown.

In addition, research has highlighted links between being sexually exploited as a young person and being sexually

exploited in adulthood. Victims of sexual abuse in childhood are 28 times more likely to be arrested for crimes associated with sex work in adulthood as non victims (Windom, 1995) and the average age for a young woman to become involved in sex work is just 12 years old (Home Office, 2004).

Unfortunately, this is a common experience for our service users. In our last

newsletter we included a piece entitled, "My Story: A Dark Place". Within this narrative, our service user speaks about being physically abused for years by her father, running away from home and being introduced to



exploitative adults by another young run away.

Kairos offers support to women who been subject to sexual exploitation, who are caught up in sex work and those who are at risk of exploitation. We aim to empower women and through our range of services, help women enjoy improved life choices and chances.

In April and May, Andrew Wright from the West Midlands Fire Service joined Kairos to carry out Fire Safety Checks for our service users.

Andrew gave out fire safety advice, free smoke alarms and specialist equipment to those service users who have specific needs.

For service users who have

mobility difficulties or find it hard to wake up, Andrew ensured that this information was logged on the fire service database so that this information is know in the event of a fire.

We would like to thank Andrew and the West Midlands Fire Service for their continuing support.

Women on Canvas

This month Kairos launched its annual project 'Women On Top' (WOT), a performing arts project run by Kairos in collaboration with Caste Away Arts, who work with marginalised groups. The WOT project offers a platform for women to express themselves through art, creative writing and performance, allowing them to find and sound their voice through artistic freedom and expression.

As in previous years women will be given the opportunity to write and perform their own monologues. From the 17th July, between 6-8pm at St Mary & St Benedicts Church and taking place each Wednesday throughout July and August, Coventry women are invited to attend workshops with Kairos volunteer Jen Bakewell and Caste Away Arts director Reena Jaisiah. Participants will be

encouraged to consider themselves and to articulate in their own voice their own unique identities; those aspects, experiences, thoughts and dreams that make them the, spirited, unique and strong women they are. The monologues will be performed by those women publicly later in the year and tickets can be purchased by the general public. Check out our website for further details in the coming weeks.

This year we have expanded WOT, adding a new project entitled 'Women on Canvas'. As the title suggests we are encouraging women to paint their self portraits onto large canvases. We hope these pieces will be inspired by positive affirmations, aspirations

and hope.

We've already begun the painting sessions. During WINGS and Evening Drop In sessions women have contributed by capturing a piece of themselves in painting. It's not an easy task, as we found out; all the staff have contributed a piece and believe me, being faced with a blank canvas, armed with nothing but your own thoughts and a paintbrush is a very intimidating thing. But the Kairos women have thrown themselves into the task with real passion and we are very proud of their achievements.

The finished canvases will be displayed publicly and we think viewers will also be proud of what the women have achieved and take inspiration from it. The details are not yet finalised so please see our website soon for further information on where the paintings will be displayed and come along to enjoy the exhibition.
